*Q.* Hi Sinha Madam, I am a postdoctoral fellow in US. I applied to one of the iiser in India, but what I observed is that the institute doesnt even reply on the final outcome of the application. I think we atleast deserve a reply to our application and what are the reasons for our application rejection. Thanks.

A. There is a complete crunch for open positions in all IISERs. So most likely you haven't heard back because we haven't yet processed the applications - probably due to the current paucity in open positions. The IISERs have asked for more positions, but we are still awaiting the sanction of these positions from the government.

Q. What is the prospect for postdocs with new research skills in academic institutes specially research areas which are now at an early stage in India? (Asked by Saurabh Awasthi)

A. New research skills including non-traditional areas are most welcome in KIIT University.

*Q. How much does the age of applicant affect in his/her selection process?*A. Below 35 is often preferred...
